National Trails Day®

Taking place on the first Saturday in June, National Trails Day® is a day of public events aimed at advocacy and trail service. Tens of thousands of hikers, bikers, paddlers, horseback riders, trail clubs, federal and local agencies, land trusts, and businesses come together in partnership to advocate for, maintain, and clean up public lands and trails.

As the state affiliate for the American Hiking Society, the Connecticut Forest & Park Association (CFPA) was an early adopter of National Trails Day.

- Our Mission: to connect people to Connecticut's forests, parks, and Blue-Blazed Hiking Trails and ensure these special places are protected and well-managed for future generations.
- In 1929, CFPA launched the Blue-Blazed Hiking Trails 825-mile trail system that spans 96 towns—including the New England National Scenic Trail.
- CFPA advances forest education, trail stewardship, and land conservation through programs like Master Woodland Manager, Project Learning Tree, Connecticut Woodlands Conservation Corps, and Connecticut Trails Day.
- Your statewide coordinator of Connecticut Trails Day since 1993!



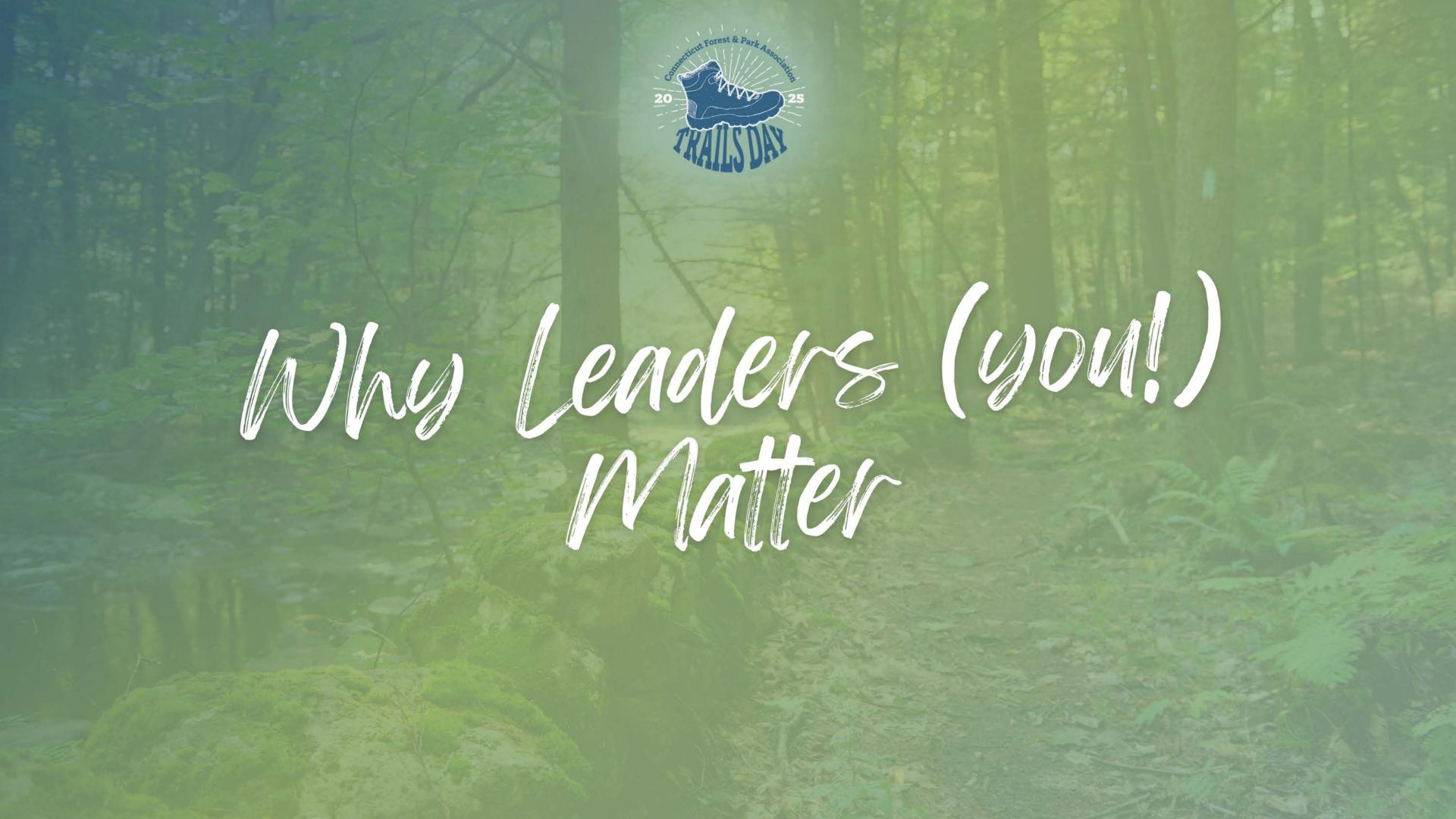




A Statewide Celebration!

- Connecticut Trails Day has grown into a two-day celebration with events throughout the state.
- With over 200 events, Connecticut leads the nation in hosting more Trails Day events than any other state.
- Free, guided outdoor experiences break down barriers to the outdoors so more people of all ages, backgrounds, and abilities can get outside!

SETTING UP YOUR EVENT



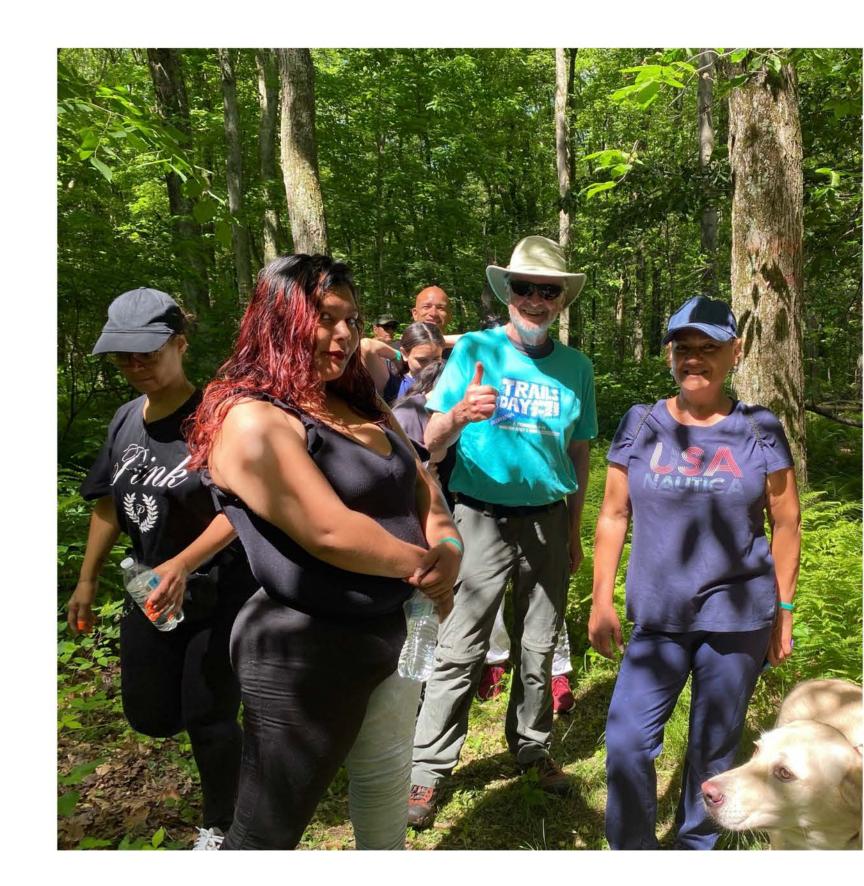


SUBMIT ONCE, CHECK TWICE!

- Register your event by May 9th; **T-shirt deadlin April 18th**
- Double-check your meeting location on trailsday.org
- Make sure the map pin is placed exactly where participants should meet
- Include helpful notes for participants, like:
 - If parking is limited or tricky
 - o If the meeting spot is hard to find or unmarked
 - o If the terrain is steep, rocky, or otherwise challenging



Ask yourself: Is there anywhere I can add clarity to help people feel more prepared? It could be someone's first time on a trail!







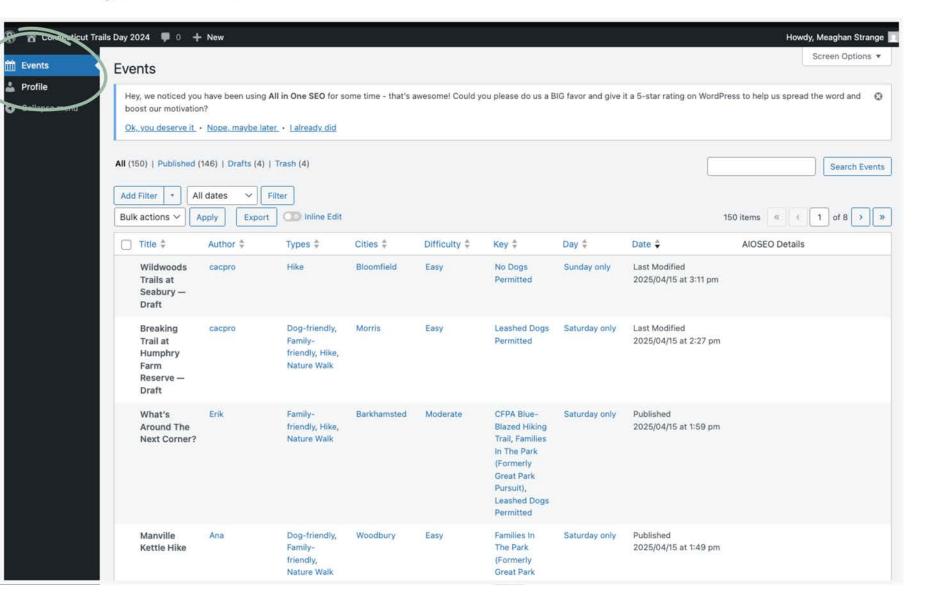
NO CHILD LEFT INSIDETM & FAMILIES IN THE PARKS

- CT Trails Day is a proud partner of No Child Left Inside™, a statewide initiative to get families outdoors and exploring nature together.
- Events that are welcoming to kids and families should:
 - Feature easy terrain and shorter distances
 - Prioritize safety for children
 - Make it fun to be outside!

NEED TO MAKE A CHANGE?

- Go to trailsday.org and click the "Sign-In" button in the top right corner
- Your username is your email address
- Once signed in, access your account dashboard to edit event details (description, meeting location, map pin)
- Upload any maps, photos, links, or event files
- If you're leading multiple events, they'll all appear in the same dashboard

PARTICIPANT REGISTRATION

Registration opens May 141

Simple & Quick Registration

Participants register easily at **trailsday.org**. They provide their name and contact information. Only takes a minute or two to complete!

Built-in Waiver

During registration, participants must agree to a waiver. Waivers help protect you, your organization, and CFPA.

Automated Emails

Participants receive a confirmation email with event details. You'll also get a copy of each confirmation for your records.





WHAT TO DO ABOUT UNREGISTERED PARTICIPANTS?



- Sometimes, not everyone registers
- It's OK to turn unregistered participants away if you're at capacity or it impacts group safety
- If you accept anyone unregistered, ask them to complete the waiver form (trailsday.org/resources)
- Please **return completed unregistered waivers** so we can track rates and collect participant numbers

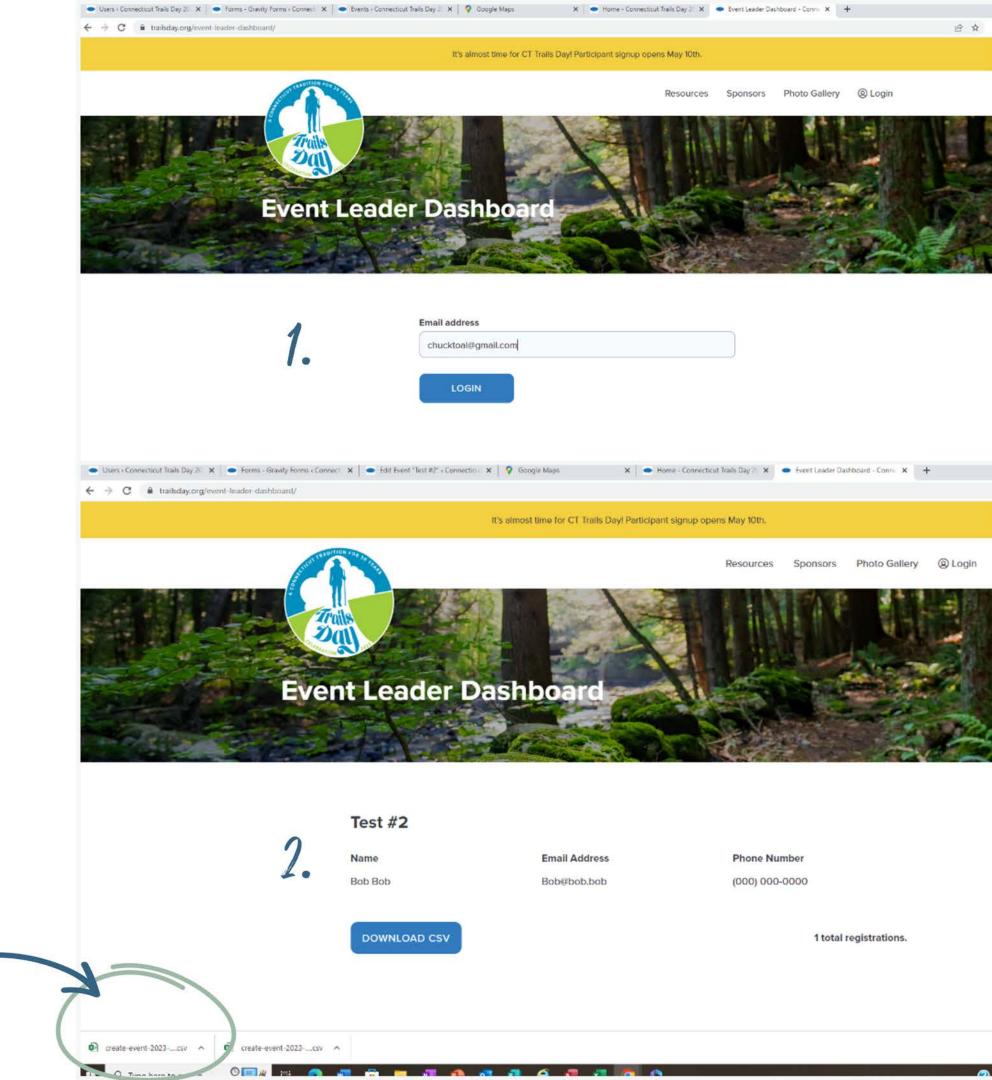


Your Event Leader Dashboard

Access your event leader dashboard: trailsday.org/event-leader-dashboard.

- Enter your email address
- Click your event to access your full registration list and contact info anytime
- Download the list as a CSV file from your Event Leader Dashboard
- Use contact info to send reminders or updates before your event

Have a unique hike, paddle, or themed event planned? We feature "Cool" events each week leading up to Trails Day. Yours could be next!





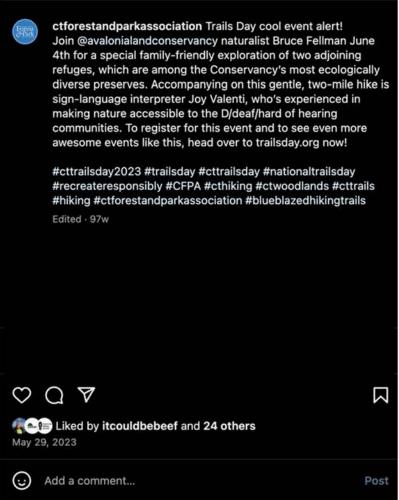

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HOW CFPA PROMOTES TRAILS DAY

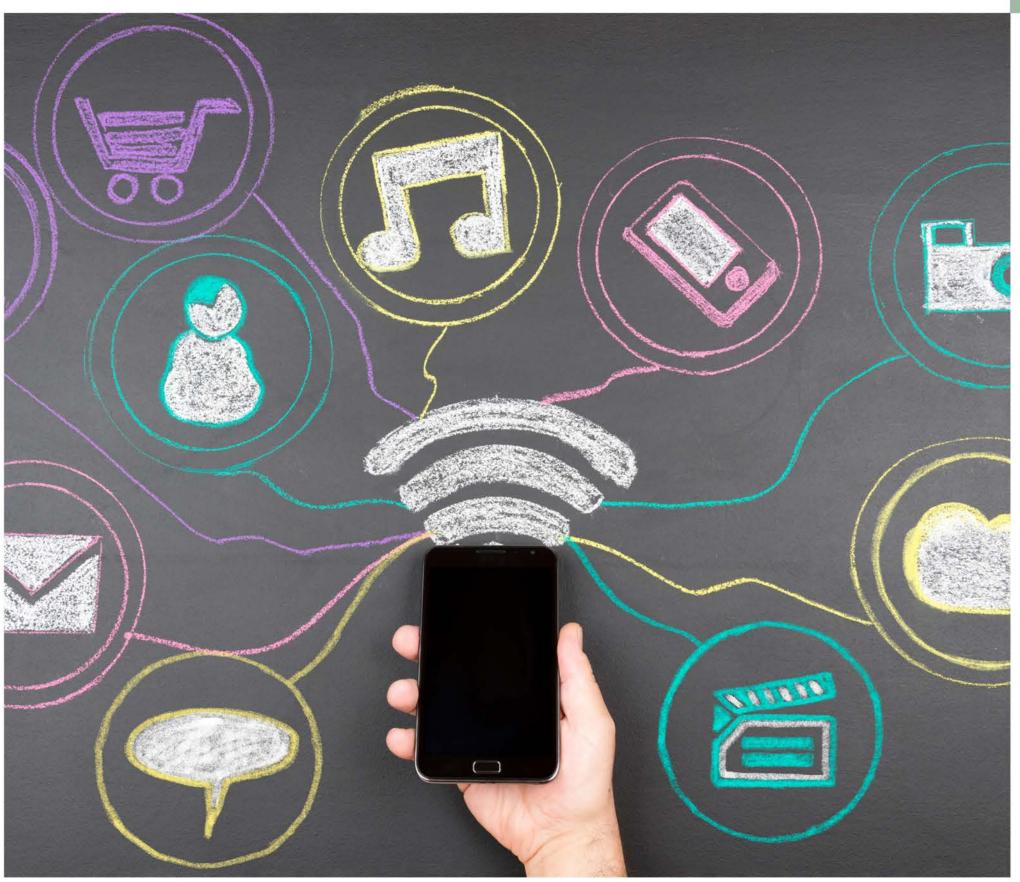

PREPARING FOR YOUR EVENT



3 WEEKS BEFORE

- Access the Toolbox and download posters, templates, and other marketing materials
- Share your event on Facebook and with local newspapers using your event URL
- Partner with community groups to help spread the word and boost attendance











1 WEEK BEFORE

- Download and print directional signs
- Prep handouts and email confirmations
- Walk the trail and confirm conditions
- Coordinate tasks with co-leaders

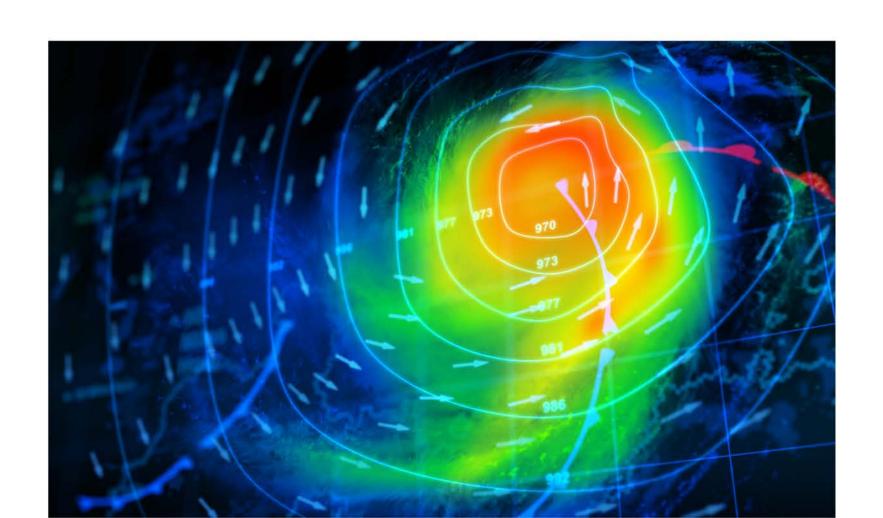


Send your participants a confirmation email before the event! It helps improve attendance and is a good way to introduce yourself.



1 DAY BEFORE

- Final trail check: Any problems?
- Check weather forecasts and notify attendees of any changes
- Gather all your materials (signs, registration lists, handouts, drop-in waivers)

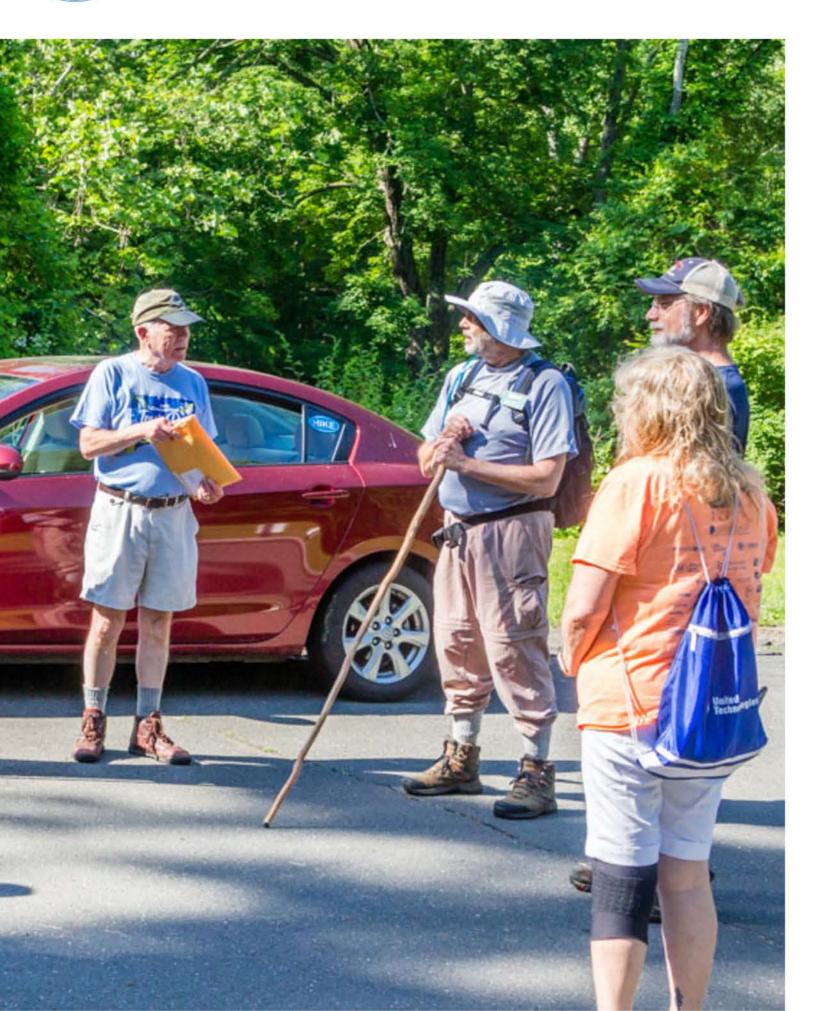






LEADING A GREAT EVENT





FIRST FIVE MINUTES

- Welcome and introduce yourself (and your org!)
- Briefly share what CFPA does, the Blue-Blazed Hiking Trails, & why Trails Day matters
- Explain the plan: route, time, terrain, stops
- Emphasize safety as the top priority
- Highlight any known hazards (ticks, bugs, sun, rough terrain)

Set a positive, inclusive tone—they'll follow your lead!





DURING YOUR EVENT



Keep the Group Together

Set a comfortable pace and check in often to make sure no one is left behind. A co-leader or "sweep" at the back can help ensure everyone stays connected.



Be Heard and Seen

When speaking, pause
the group and project
your voice so everyone
can hear. Face your
audience and speak
clearly, especially when
sharing key info or stories.



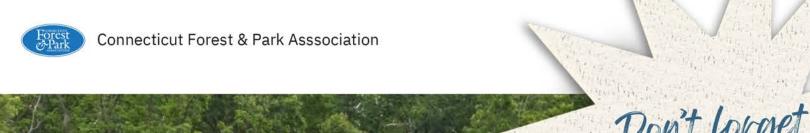
Make it Engaging

Share trail facts, fun stories, or your own experiences to keep people interested. A little personality and knowledge goes a long way!



Create a Welcoming Space

Greet everyone with a smile, encourage questions, and be attentive to the needs of the group. Safety and inclusion should always come first.









LAST FIVE MINUTES

- Thank participants for joining your hike and encourage them to support your cause
- Remind attendees how CFPA protects forests, parks, and trails and how they can get involved
- Invite participants to get more involved through other events, donations, memberships, and volunteering





AFTER YOUR EVENT

- Send us your photos at trailsday.org/media-uploads
- Watch your inbox. We'll send two surveys: one for you and one for your participants
- Send us any additional sign-ins or waivers so we can accurately report participation numbers to sponsors, partners, and grants



Send your participants a thank you email! It's a great way to keep them engaged.

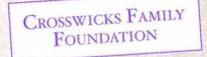




















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
